#### A MESSAGE FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

The Children's Literacy Center is proud to acknowledge a very strong 2022-2023 fiscal year; CLC received financial support from 17 foundations, celebrated the 25th Annual Vintner Dinner, added new partners and donors, gained statewide recognition from educators and state legislatures, and became a voice in high impact tutoring conversations throughout the country. The high impact tutoring program partnership between CLC and Colorado Springs School District 11 entered its second year with programming being offered at 5 elementary schools and growing to 7 by the end of the 2023-2024 school year. The expansion will allow for CLC to impact 140 underperforming students at those elementary schools using CLC's one-to-one tutoring model.

As CLC embarks on the 2023-2024 fiscal year, the goal is to increase the local footprint, expand in rural communities, and replicate the high impact tutoring model throughout the state. The 2023-2024 motto is; more students, more tutors, and more success.
