Message From The Executive Director

As the new reality settles in, Children's Literacy Center is not alone in the need to continually adjust and envision different paths to maintain one's mission. The toll that last year's virtual learning had on our most vulnerable students has been devastating and CLC is addressing this overwhelming need with vigor and resolve. CLC will always provide safe and secure tutoring environments and last year this meant renting spaces with larger capacities, tutoring less students at one time, following health and safety protocols and providing individual curricula for each student. As the new school year begins, CLC is rapidly expanding available tutoring sites, changing our business model to help schools and parents with transportation issues, and assigning a new Director of Education to quickly ramp up CLC's accessibility to every district.



The fiscal year of 2020-2021 was fortunately stable and shows no signs of changing, but steps are being taken to insure continued stability while expanding critical services. Southern Colorado has grown their tutoring sites with a new rural site in Fort Morgan set to begin this fall. So again, CLC is strongly positioned to respond to the world's unique challenges and support the belief that " it is easier to build strong children than to fix broken men" Frederick Douglass

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2020 Notable Achievements

- Successfully offered 6-4 week tutoring sessions during the summer of 2020
- Recruited and trained 198 volunteers
- Tutors completed 5,125 volunteer hours
- Tutored 193 underperforming students using the Peak Reader Curriculum
- Expanded rural tutoring program in Manzanola
- Opened 4 new tutoring sites in the Pikes Peak Region and 2 in the Denver Metro area

Moving into the 2021- 2022 School Year

As CLC moves forward in this historical time, it is critical to supplement the immense amounts of skills lost during multiple school closures and interrupted online schooling. CLC will hire an Education Director to cultivate relationships with school district personnel, increase student enrollment, hire and supervise a core of paid parttime tutors, and build relationships with political representatives to develop awareness and support of CLC's tutoring program. CLC's leadership is determined to increase the reach of programing throughout Colorado.
